## **RAILINGS NEAR TO CHURCH**

The Parish Council were very pleased to see so much interest generated in the recently discussed issue regarding the railings near to the church. The railings, as many of you will know, have been a feature of the Village Green for a number of years and have reached the stage where they require a bit of maintenance to keep them looking tidy. The query was raised at the time of discussion as to whether they should be taken down, as fencing of the Green is not legal and we do not afford that type of protection against parking on any other area of grass in the Village. The matter was discussed at our November PC meeting and it was decided to investigate the cost of replacement or repair before we consider the matter again at our January meeting. If you do have any views on this matter we would be happy to hear them.

## LAND TRANSFER

The transfer of the two pockets of land from Cumbria County Council is now complete. The legal paperwork has been signed by the Parish Council which gives us ownership of the two pieces of land in the Village.

## SPEEDING

Three volunteers have come forward to be trained for the radar speed gun for use in the parish. Their details have been forwarded to the police to enable the training to be carried out.

## CHILDREN'S PLAY SCHEME

Three Sports and Physical Activity Days were held in the Village Hall in August. These were on the whole well supported with 54 children attending over the 3 days. Thanks are once again given to the Play Area Group and Cumbria County Council for funding the days in full.

## RECYCLING BINS

As reported in the previous edition, the Parish Council have been looking into recycling following the concerns of some Parishioners. The recycling centre has been monitored over the past 4 months and it is great to see that it is so frequently used. The Parish Council no longer gain monetary benefits from the recycling centre as they did previously, and these are really in addition to the collections that most of the Parish receive every two weeks. However, some outlying properties do not receive these door to door collections, and the communal recycling centre is an essential part of being able to recycle materials.



We would be grateful if those using the bins could take into consideration the local residents, and if the bins are full, then please take your recycling back home for another day, or to other nearby centres (Brampton, Hethersgill). Also, some items are not able to be recycled so please do not leave these in or near to the bins. Signs will also be erected near the bins to help inform users in the near future. It is great that so many in the Parish recycle materials and it is clear that our centre is well used.

## TREES

At our September meeting we agreed to have some maintenance work carried out on some of the Lime Trees in the Village. This work is due to take place any time and may have even been carried out before you receive this newsletter. The works were essential to the health of the trees and the safety of the parish.

## BROADBAND

As you will know, the Green cabinet has been in the Parish for some time now, but has not yet been switched on. Connecting Cumbria have confirmed that there were issues and blockages whilst laying the "spine" to the Parish and this has held matters up. They are now looking at a date of Spring 2015 for superfast speeds being available in our Parish.

## VICTORIA COUNTY HISTORY AND WALTON PARISH

Compiling the Victoria County History was started by Arthur Doubleday in 1899 and dedicated to Queen Victoria. It was intended to produce a history of each English county. Arthur Doubleday underestimated the effort that would be required to complete the history and 115 years later it remains active in 34 counties including Cumberland.

The history is produced by volunteers working in each parish who compile histories of their parishes in a standard format. The parish histories are then brought together into county histories, known as Red Books. The preparation of the history is overseen by local universities, Lancaster University looks after Cumberland.

Pam and Paul Cronin have taken over the task of compiling the history for Walton Parish which was started by Libby Seddon. The history covers every aspect of parish life so do not be surprised if the Cronins ask you about your memories of the area. ## BUS SERVICES

As mentioned in the past two editions, the bus services are due to cease imminently. The Parish Council have been asked to consider working as a small group with a number of other parishes to develop a business plan to establish a volunteer service, like the Fell Runner scheme elsewhere in the County. We need your views on this—would you be willing to help be a volunteer driver? And, would you want to use such a volunteer service as a passenger? At the moment the Parish Council do not propose taking part in

the Group and unless we hear that there is sufficient demand we will not be progressing. Please get in touch asap—and no later than 6th December—if you have any strong views on this subject.

## EMAIL ALERTS

The Parish Council have become aware that sometimes when information is being delivered door-to-door in the parish the 40 or so houses that are outside the village boundary are often forgotten about. We understand how frustrating this is and how disappointing it is to realise you have missed out on information or events taking place. Although most information is published on our website it could often be missed if people do not regularly check it.—or indeed if the organisers have not sent us notice of it. ## PRECEPT

The Parish Council took the decision to raise the precept by the current inflationary rate for the financial year 2015/16. This represents a £76 increase over the whole parish (approx. 115 households). We have been informed that our income will drop by over £523 next year so we will need to carefully look at the precept next November and our spending plans.
