NEW COUNCILLORS

As you will all be aware, for the first time in many years, we had more people stand for Parish Council than the number of seats available. Eleven parishioners stood for the eight Council positions so that meant that on Thursday 7 May you all had the chance to democratically elect your councillors to serve a four year term.

Councillors elected were: Jonathan Fowler (Chairman), Tom Brocklebank (Vice-Chairman), Alan Armstrong, Simon Wood, Brian Hogg, Fraser Winter, Thomas Mounsey and Tommy Mark. Their contact details are available on the back page of this newsletter and on our website (www.waltonparish.co.uk).

The election did mean we lost some well established Councillors. Alan Armstrong chose not to re-stand in the election and Gordon Kyle and Austen Davies were unsuccessful in being elected. Our sincere thanks go to all three councillors for their efforts for the parish council over the years. We of course also lost our Chairman, who chose not to re-stand in the election - John Evans.....

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

RECYCLING BINS

Signage has recently been placed near the recycling bins to try and remind some users of the basic rules, namely, please wash and squash your items; and please do only place the correct waste in the appropriate bins. We also would remind you that if the bins are full then waste cannot be left adjacent to them - you risk being prosecuted for fly-tipping if you do.

RAILINGS NEAR TO CHURCH

Work remains ongoing to tidy up the railings near to the church. Many thanks go to Councillor Armstrong and his helpers for the work they have done to date to straighten up the railings and to replace the missing links. We will finalise the refurbishment arrangements at our September meeting.

NOTICEBOARD

A suggestion has been made to move the noticeboard from the Village Green to inside the bus shelter. We propose to make this move during September unless we have significant and valid objections. If you are concerned please do contact us and explain your concerns.

BORDER RAMBLER BUS SERVICE

The volunteer bus service we have discussed in previous editions of this newsletter is aiming to be up and running by early September. PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The dates for our Parish Council meetings in 2015 are set to take place as follows:

Provisionally the first meeting in the New Year will be taking place on Monday 11th January 2016. Please remember we sometimes need to change the date but we always post the official notice of the meeting date on the noticeboard and website three clear working days in advance (the Tuesday before the Monday meeting). Additional meetings are also called when necessary for urgent business, normally planning applications.

WALTON MOOR SLEEPERS

Work to improve the pathways in the Moor will commence in late September/ early October. Many thanks to City Councillor Bowman and County Councillor Mallinson for helping to fund the purchase of new sleepers, which will be laid voluntarily by Councillors.

CHILDREN'S PLAY SCHEME

We would like to inform you that we will be holding a children's activity day in the village hall We have arranged a date of Thursday 20th August between 10am and 3pm. The



scheme will be delivered by the Cumbrian Sports and Physical Activities Foundation using fully trained play workers. The council have appointed Mel Warwick as her replacement. Please do remember we have to work within new transparency guidelines which means all of our financial information is available to view on our website.

BROADBAND

Do you run a business? Small and medium size enterprises are being offered help to apply for £3,000 vouchers to spend on superfast broadband connections. To receive a voucher, businesses need a bespoke connection quotation or to take a pre-registered package from a registered supplier (IP River, at Kingmoor Park, Carlisle, is the only registered supplier in Cumbria). The vouchers are issued on a first-come first-served basis and the £40m fund runs until March 2016, or until the money runs out. More information is online atwww.connectionvouchers.co.uk.
