ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

CHAIRS REPORT

Looking back over the last year the Parish Council have been very busy. Although a lot of the work has little tangible evidence, the Parish Council have actually been very active within the community while continuing to support the needs and wishes of the parishioners.

The Parish Council realise the benefit of the work that groups and organisations do within the community and have actively supported and worked with the Walton Village Hall Management Committee, the Walton Village Hall Social Committee, the Play Area Group, the Cumbria Rural Support Group and Carlisle Parish Councils Association. In addition the Parish Council also work alongside the City and County Council for the benefit of the parish. The Parish Council have also supported local initiatives such as attending the William Howard Young Citizen project.

Specific work and achievements undertaken by the Parish Council this year include; completion of the Community Led Plan which provides information on the views, opinions and wishes of the parishioners and provides an

action plan for future projects, continued provision of an active web site and newsletter to provide information to parishioners, support for the purchase and a commitment for the ongoing upkeep of the defibrillator.

Projects which have been undertaken or are ongoing include working with the police with respect to perceived speeding, working with the City Council dog enforcement officer, provision of support and promotion for superfast broadband to the parish and working on the asset transfer of land from the County Council. The Parish Council have also developed a tree management plan and a policy for tracks on the village green.

Financially the Parish Council are aware of the continuing hard economic times and with this in mind agreed to keep the precept increase down to a low amount and instead use the reserves we have, while maintaining the services we offer.

Once again it is worth mentioning that the councillors are all volunteers and the work we do is in our own time. I would like to thank the councillors for their hard work and support and extend that to the Clerk, Sarah Kyle, and the City and County Councillors, Syd Bowman and John Mallinson for their continued advice and support as well as the support Lawrence Fisher provided before the boundary changes meant he was no longer our County Councillor.

While we do try to provide a service to the parish we are aware that there are some areas where people consider we are deficient and could improve. Please let us know if or how we can improve the work we do and while I cannot offer any guarantees of improvement I can promise we will do our best for the parish.

FIRST AID/DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

As most of you will have noticed, the defibrillator is now installed on the exterior of the Village Hall. In the event of an emergency you will be given the code for the cabinet by the 999 operators in order to access the defibrillator. A large number of people attended our first aid training which we hope was very useful. If you have any questions on the defibrillator please don't hesitate to get in touch with us.



SPEEDING

Following concerns over speeding in the village, the CRASH team

installed a speed measurement device in two locations. Results indicated that the mean speed alongside the village green was 22.5mph and the mean speed alongside Irthing View was 24.7mph. Following these results it was very kindly agreed with Cumbria Constabulary that they would go ahead with plans to install a temporary "Speed Indication Device" in the village to help motorists gauge their speed perception. At the time of writing we were waiting for the SID to be delivered so watch this space.

TREES

We have had some very high winds in recent months. As such we are having a "climbing" risk inspection carried out of the lime trees to ensure their continued safety. A crown uplift has also now been carried out to tidy them up before the new growth begins. If you do have any concerns or questions over any tree in the parish please contact us. Please do not attempt to do any work yourself on them. Our insurance cover is dependent upon us using trained and qualified persons for such works and it is important we ensure that only these people are employed.

BROADBAND

As some of you may have seen, a new green cabinet has been installed near the bus stop in the centre of the village. This is good news which suggests that progress is being made in order to deliver superfast broadband to the Parish. There is no news yet regarding when it will go "live". OIL BUYING CO-OPERATIVE

Would you be interested in potentially saving money when purchasing your heating oil? The Parish Council is supporting a community initiative to create an oil buying co-operative in the parish. If residents can get a full tanker delivery to a 'collective' it will result in oil being a few pence cheaper than by making individual purchases. It is economical (time and transport costs) to the supplier and has proven successful in other parts of the Country already.

However many 'members' are involved, all would get topped up at the instigation of the person who needs fuel - it doesn't matter if the demand is for more than one tanker full; in that event everyone gets enough to keep them going and another load is triggered as soon as anyone needs more. A chosen volunteer would be responsible for the ordering of each tanker but your bill would still be sent individually to you and only local suppliers would be used.

CHILDREN'S PLAY SCHEME

We are very pleased to announce that we will be holding some children's activity days in the village hall during the summer. We have arranged dates of Thursday 7th August, Thursday 14th

August and Thursday 21st August between 10am and 3pm. The scheme will be delivered by the Cumbrian Sports and Physical Activities Foundation using fully trained play workers. The days are open to all children aged between 5 and 12 years old and will cost £3 per day. You will need to send your child with a packed lunch and drink. All bookings for the days are to be made directly with the Cumbrian Sports Foundation—details will be provided on the



noticeboards and in local children's schoolbags. We will also publish the booking details on the website and Facebook so please do keep a watch on these for more information. The days have been funded by the Walton Parish Play Area Group and the Cumbria County Council Community Grants.

CAMP OUT

Following the disappointment of having to cancel the last planned camp out on the Village Green due to the atrocious weather, the Play Area Group are currently putting plans in place to organise a new date during Summer 2014. LAND TRANSFER

The asset transfer of the two pieces of County Council land to the Parish Council is slowly making progress. Legal agreements between ourselves and the County Council have delayed the process considerably but we are hopeful to have the contracts signed very soon.

VILLAGE HALL

You are invited to the **Annual General Meeting of Walton Village Hall on Friday 16th May 2014 at 7:00pm**. The AGM is open to all parishioners so please come along.

We are a friendly, welcoming group of volunteers who work to ensure the successful future of our Village Hall. We are always open to fresh ideas, and are keen to welcome new committee members. We have a number of interesting projects planned and any help, either on a regular or one off basis, would be greatly appreciated.

There are a number of roles that the volunteers at Walton Village Hall, which is a registered charity, perform. These include:

- the upkeep of the building, including co-ordinating routine maintenance, day-to-day running requirements and bookings administration;
- larger project work for the improvement of the facilities provided;
- fundraising and sourcing of appropriate grant funding to subsidise the letting income of the village hall; and
- promotion and provision of hall premises for community use and organising community events.

Questionnaires will shortly be distributed to all households and user groups to find out what you would like from the village hall. Please do take the time to respond, as it is your suggestions that will help decide future plans, events and projects. Even if you do not currently use the village hall your views are important to us to help draw up a "wish list" of what Hall users would like.

Over the last year we have improved some of the facilities, including a boiler replacement, a new flat roof, refurbishment of the toilets and installation of a sliding door. This was enabled with funding from Cumbria County Council Community Grants; County Councillor John Mallinson; Walton Parish Council; Carlisle Parish Councils Association; Carlisle City Council and City Councillor Sid Bowman, together with regular letting income and funds raised at events organised by Walton Village Hall Social Committee. We would like to thank these funders for their support and also thank all Hall users for their patience

whilst these renovations took place.

This month has seen the folding of Walton Village Hall Social Committee in its current format following the resignation of its members. We would like to thank Linda Wilson, Hazel Winter, Fraser Winter, Gill Whiteford, Tommy Mark, Moira Mark, Hazel Douglas and all past committee members who have given their valuable time and energy to this cause over the years. We are taking this opportunity to review the way the Walton Village Hall committee is structured, and as we have several social events planned for this year we will soon be looking for volunteers to help us make these happen.

A very simple way to support our Village Hall is to register for free with www.easyfundraising.org.uk/causes/waltonvillagehall and select Walton Village Hall as your good cause. You can then raise donations when you shop online, without costing you any extra. UK taxpayers can help raise even more by signing up to Gift Aid too. Thanks to our supporters shopping online, we've already raised £48.67.

The notice board on the Village Hall now displays a new activities sheet which details regular Hall user groups and useful contact phone numbers.

We are pleased to welcome Heather and Vicky back as Walton Tearoom opens for the 2014 season. They are open week days 10am – 4pm, why not pop in for a tasty lunch or a sweet treat!

Walton Post Office (open Monday & Wednesday 9.30am – 12pm in the Hall) has just been awarded funding to provide computers for community use. They will be connected to the internet, and have printing facilities. We are hoping to run basic training for anyone interested in learning to use a computer and the internet. More information will follow soon.

RURAL WHEELS

Rural Wheels provides door-to-door transport for people who do not have, or are unable to access scheduled transport.

The service can be used for a variety of purposes including:

- Making connections with buses or trains
- Doctor, Dentist or Optician appointments
- Visiting friends or family in hospital
- Shopping
- Visiting friends or family

It does not duplicate other County Council transport provision and therefore cannot be used for transport to day care, school, nursery or college and

cannot be used for hospital appointments/treatment if Patient Transport is available. If you need transport to get you to your hospital appointment please check your eligibility for Patient Transport by contacting the Patient Transport Service run by North West Ambulance on 0800 032 3240.

Rural Wheels uses a 'Smartcard' to pay for travel and a central booking system to plan journeys. Passengers need to apply for the Smartcard before they are able to travel. The value of the Smartcard can be topped up with the transport provider or alternatively at local post offices (including Brampton Post Office), libraries and mobile libraries. It can be topped up by £5, £10 or £20 per time. Transport requests must be booked by telephone before noon the day before travelling and passengers may be asked to be flexible about their travel time and also to share transport which will be at a reduced fare.

ACCOUNTS

A summary of our accounts is provided for you on the following page. Please note these have not yet been either internally verified or externally audited as yet and hence are subject to change and correction. Thanks go to our Internal Verifier Pam Cronin for volunteering to check through them; once Pam has confirmed their accuracy the accounts are subject to national audit checks also. When the external audit report is complete notice is published in case any of you wish to inspect the accounts— full details of the dates and times they are available will be published too.

You will notice we have made a healthy gain this year. This is partly due to almost £1000 being carried forward for the tree work we mentioned earlier. We also saved a little money with reduced grass cutting costs due to the wet weather and the decision to not print every house a copy of the Community Led Plan. On top of that the figures include a large amount of money specifically ring-fenced for play area led projects—such as the play days we will provide during August that we mentioned earlier in the newsletter. Finally we have also a little bit of money still to pay out for the electrical installation of the defibrillator (any spare money will be kept for on-going maintenance). If you have any more detailed questions about the accounts please contact the Clerk who will hopefully be able to answer you.
